BETA TAU WINS 24TH COURT OF HONOR AWARD, STRIVES FOR HUGH SHIELDS

- Shelter is becoming outdated compared to other UNL campus buildings
- Delt must compete with luxury residence halls and updated dormitories
- Other UNL fraternities have updated chapter houses to remain competitive



Peter Kiewit's famous business mantra was that he always found himself "pleased, but not satisfied." As a new academic year begins, I believe this simple, yet poignant phrase is a perfect representation of the general feeling of both the undergraduate chapter and the House Corporation.

Last year, the undergraduates saw success in many aspects of their programming and operations. They were recognized for their achievements by receiving Beta Tau's 24th Court of Honor, an award given annually to the top 20 chapters of Delta Tau Delta. This is no small accomplishment given the fact that there are currently 125 active Delt chapters across the country. Yet, falling just short of receiving the chapter's 21st Hugh Shields (awarded to the top 10 chapters) has left the undergraduates hungry for more. They are working diligently to successfully implement their proven programs and to improve those which still need work. With a solid group of undergraduate officers in place, we are hopeful that Beta Tau will bring home a nation-leading 21st Hugh Shields Award this winter.

Meanwhile, the House Corporation has been hard at work this summer revising and improving the long-term plan for the Shelter. While adequate, the facility is beginning to show its age. There have been no truly comprehensive updates to the interior (other than limited cosmetic improvements) since the addition of the west half of the building in 1970. Given the changes that have occurred on the University of Nebraska campus over the last 40 years, both in terms of the buildings located thereon and the persons who occupy them, it is easy to see why our great Shelter has fallen behind the curve of the 21st century student needs. Moreover, the university's recent construction of three luxury residence halls for upperclassmen, and extensive renovations to most dormitories, has introduced a very real competitor to UNL fraternities for solid new members. Several of the fraternities have responded with renovations of their own, and many others have similar plans underway.

The urgency of this project has been spurred on by the University's mandate that all Greek houses have fire sprinklers installed in every room. This unavoidable project will require extensive opening of the Shelter's ceilings and walls, which provides an appropriate time to consider other long-term improvements. To this extent, the House Corporation has engaged professional consultants to help us advance the Shelter's core functions: a shared symbol of our tradition at UNL, a welcoming home for our undergraduate men, a living environment where young Delts

today become leaders of tomorrow, and a proud statement of the Fraternity's mission, "Committed to Lives of Excellence."
