Academics

The last year has seen some exciting changes as we have made significant jumps in all-campus academic rankings. The chapter utilized a revamped in-house tutoring system to improve from a ranking of 20th out of 24 to a respectable 10th. The chapter is determined to be among the top five fraternities in average

reetings! As another school year comes to a close, we congratulate the undergraduate chapter on a successful semester and are eager to see what the coming year has in store. Mindful of the challenges that our undergraduates face today, we are excited to have such a large and enthusiastic House Corporation in place that is focused on reconnecting all of our alumni with the chapter and improving the undergraduate experience.

In fact, the 11-member board is the largest group of volunteers the House Corporation has enjoyed. Moreover, the members bring an excellent mix of dedicated experience and young enthusiasm. Tom Wolf '66, Bruce Christiansen '69, and Ryan Stowe '00 have nearly 25 years of service between the three of them, many of those years spent as officers, and eight members graduated in the 2000s, including five who joined the board within the last two years. We are excited to have the involvement of two Delt alumni from

other chapters, Jim Loach, Georgia Southern '70, and Ryan Caldwell, University of Nebraska-Kearney '02.

With this diverse and talented board in place, we are ready to help the undergraduates confront the largest challenges that face them today. One of the most dramatic challenges that has arisen in the last couple of years is the increased competition on campus with new residence halls, apartments, and renovated Greek houses. Specifically, there has been a strong trend toward improving comforts such as central heat/air systems and suite-style rooms. The UNL Board of Regents just approved \$40.5 million in funding for the second apartment-style dorm to be completed in July 2010. In addition, both Sigma Phi Epsilon and Farmhouse have completed major renovations to their houses. To remain competitive on campus, the House Corporation is initiating a study to determine the feasibility of a large-scale update to the Shelter. At a min-

Scott says, "I initially started looking at Delt because of my dad and my brother, Jim, Iowa State '08, and it didn't take long to realize that the chapter was full of all-around great guys. During recruitment I found that these were people who really had their heads on straight, worked hard, and still knew how to have fun. I had the idea of joining a fraternity solely to meet people and make new friends but realized I could get much more out of my fraternity experience by joining Delt. Being a Delt these last three years, I've learned more and more about my dad than I ever would have otherwise.
