MAN OF VISION Spotlight on Paul Engler '47

Paul Engler '47 received his introduction to the University of Nebraska and Delta Tau Delta while in his hometown of Rock County, Nebraska. Several men from the town were Delts, providing Paul an immediate connection.

"My time as an undergraduate was a unique period in the history of the chapter. With men returning from the war, there was a mix of ages among the men living at 1143 Jay Street. This added a whole new dimension to my life and provided the opportunity to learn from others' experiences. Having grown up without any brothers, I quickly learned the lessons of how to live with a group of men and gleaned the social graces necessary to enter into adulthood."

Upon entering college, Paul's desire was to become a veterinarian. Since the University did not offer the program, Paul found experience working at a veterinary office, often going in at five in the morning. He worked "I loved being a Delt.

hard to complete his education in agriculture, waiting tables and washing dishes at the chapter, but was sure to make time for friendships.

In the 1960s, Paul, a Nebraska cattleman, had the vision to begin large-scale cattle feeding in Texas. His ideas would help turn a fledgling cattle feeding enterprise into a billion-dollar industry for the state. Several of Paul's notable achievements include starting the first large-scale commercial feedyard, designing the Iowa Beef Packer's packing plant in Amarillo, and establishing industry practices for quality beef production. In 1975, Paul founded Cactus Feeders, which today employs more than 500 people and stands as the world's largest privately owned cattle feeding company. Paul is chairman of the board.

"I built my business as a company focused on people, understanding that what I can accomplish by myself is limited. By surrounding myself with the best people, our potential is unlimited."

Paul lives in Amarillo and has six children, nine grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren. When he is away from the work he loves, Paul enjoys hunting, fishing, and boating.

FRATERNAL BONDS BROUGHT MICHAEL "MICK" TOOLEY '56 TO BETA TAU

Fraternal bonds on a number of levels brought Mick Tooley '56 into the fold of Delta Tau Delta. His older brothers, Bob '52 and Dick '53, were Delts and their membership provided Mick the opportunity to see the close friendships that the fraternity made possible.

"Beta Tau offered a home base on a large campus. Dick's pledge class set an example for those of us who followed. They were an outstanding representation of friendship and loyalty. The chapter was the

place where I learned discipline and maturity. Mom Hinds was a huge part of my learning experience, teaching us everything from bridge to manners. We could go to her at any time with seemingly any problem."

The Delt tradition was continued in the Tooley family with younger brothers **Pat '59** and **Bill '65**. While Bob has passed away, the brothers meet every year and enjoy reflecting on their shared experience. Their father used to joke that he paid a house bill for 25 straight years to give them all the Delt experience.



After college, Mick served in the Army then began an 18-year career with Phillips Petroleum. The job took Mick and his family from Colorado to Idaho to California, with a happy landing in Sacramento. When company changes meant another move, Mick saw the transition as an opportunity to venture out on his own. In 1978, Mick started Tooley Oil Co., of which he is still president.

"Over 30 years later, I still employ some of the same people that started with me. We work to bring honesty and respect into every business situation, and I strive to communicate dedication, loyalty, and fairness by working just as hard or harder than anyone else in the company. Starting my own business was a risk that has certainly paid off."
